Public Service Announcement in Response to COVID-19

Please be advised of the following measures the Town of Floyd has engaged in to help keep our citizens and personnel safe:

- Implemented reduced work schedule and alternating shifts for all employees and telework solutions for the safe continuance of government operations.
- Implemented utilization of masks and gloves for all town employees.
- Developed a section on our webpage within the Town of Floyd website to host information, facts and updates on COVID-19.
- Temporarily closed all public access to the Town of Floyd Office.
- Temporarily closed the Warren G. Lineberry playground and the public restroom facilities.
- Temporarily suspended recycling and cardboard services for businesses and residents.
- The following local government functions will continue: Town Office operation, Trash services, Water and Sewer services.
- Implemented a Meals and Lodging Amnesty Program.
- Implemented a Town Loan Pool Amnesty Program.
- Extended a 60-day grace period on Vehicle License Tax payments due on April 15th.

Please continue to do your part to help prevent the spread of COVID-19 by:

- Washing your hands with soap and water or use hand sanitizer
- Keeping household surfaces clean (including cell phones)
- Coughing or sneezing into a tissue (and discard it) or your interior elbow
- Avoid touching your mouth, nose, eyes or face
- Practice Social Distancing and avoid shaking hands
- Remain home if you are sick, start to feel sick, and avoid others who are sick
